Amazing Numbers!

You know that numbers aren't the be all and end all at Fishergate – we are much more interested in helping to create well-rounded young humans who will make the world a better place – but we are very proud of our Y1s and Y6s and I wanted to share their achievements with you all. 91% of Y1s passed their phonics check, this is the first time that we have ever broken the 90% barrier. The Year 6s also did brilliantly in their SATs with 79% of children attaining expected or above in reading and writing and 81% in maths. National figures are reading 74%, writing 72% and maths 73%, so Fishergate children deserve to be very proud of themselves. A huge well done to the adults who have worked so hard to make this happen. Obviously their teachers and teaching assistants, but also David Pennington and Lauren Moss who have worked tirelessly on a whole school level and really changed our approach to phonics and maths teaching.

SMARTPHONE- FREE CHILDHOOD

You may have noticed the new yellow banner at the front of school this week. This is part of our commitment to support the wellbeing of our children, based on growing evidence about the harms of smartphones.

As a school, we introduced a smartphone and smartwatch ban in 2022. We are committed to supporting the school community in this challenging area, providing advice and workshops for parents.

Earlier this year, North Yorkshire police gave a talk at school following WhatsApp group chats that involved some of our year 5/6 pupils. A significant group of year 6 pupils will be leaving the school next week smartphone free, opting for a basic Nokia (or similar) device for year 7. Fulford School has confirmed no smartphones are needed for Key Stage 3 classes.
