**EYU –** This week in Early Years, we have been writing about all the interesting little creatures we have seen in the forest. We found slugs, snails, wood lice and wiggly worms. We have also begun rehearsals for our Christmas show so your little ones may come home singing some festive tunes.

- working collaboratively in the local area, including working with those seeking sanctuary, to share our values and efforts




