## **PHASE UPDATES**

**EYU** – This week in Early Years we have been full of the joys of spring. We have been learning and performing the poem ‘A little seed’ and then planting our own little sunflower seeds. We are looking forward to seeing them grow and finding out how tall they will get. In Maths, we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes.

**Year 1/2** – Key Stage 1 have been continuing their dinosaur topic by beginning to write their own 'Who Am I?' dinosaur poem. We have also received some exciting surprises from Mr Barlett, in the form of some real dinosaur bones! The children have had the opportunity to handle a plesiosaur vertebrae and a mosasaur tooth, which were both found in the UK!

**Year 3/4** - have been learning all about how to be persuasive, using rhetorical questions, exaggerations and emotive language.
